# The call, the planes, the treatment plan

Elijah Presiados was a 19 year old student attending college in the Philippines in fall of 2016 when he found out he was sick. He hadn't really been feeling well, but the pace and pressures of school kept him focused. When he finally went to the doctor, a CT scan found a mass in his chest. After several frantic phone calls home, it was decided with limited treatment service options in the Philippines and at home in Hawaii he would fly directly to New York where he had extended family. Within hours Elijah was in route to New York Presbyterian Hospital-Weill Cornell and his parents were on a plane to meet him. Once there, Elijah was quickly diagnosed with Primary Mediastinal Lymphoma with DLBLC. A condition that when not treated aggressively is fatal. They knew they had made the right choice. Elijah immediately started treatment and 6 cycles of intense chemotherapy that lasted nearly 7 months.

Meanwhile, his father Nonie traveled back and forth to maintain his position at Hualalai as a Landscape Field Supervisor for Chambers Landscape. One day while at work, a homeowner suggested that he contact the Ohana Foundation for assistance. Reluctantly, Nonie came to the office. He was surprised to learn that with donation support from homeowners like you HOF is able to provide grant assistance for Serious Medical cases like Elijah's.

It was a traumatic roller coaster ride for Elijah and his ohana with hurdles, successes and many set-backs along the way. Finally in March of 2017, Elijah came home to Hawaii with an excellent long-term prognosis and is considered *in remission*. You may see him around Hualalai as he is now working part-time with his dad and continuing his routine follow-up in Oahu.
